Cyclist improves bicycle

Lee Middleton, from Brotton, North Yorkshire, grew tired of slogging up the hills around his village on his bicycle but couldn't afford one the flashy electric models you see about these days. So instead he fitted a small petrol engine from a remote-controlled car to drive his back wheel. He was stopped by the police when they heard the racket it was making and charged with having no licence, no insurance and no helmet as well as having his bike confiscated. Teesside magistrates subsequently



fined him £239 with costs and gave him 8 penalty points. Lee later said "it's all right for those who can afford electric bikes to go whizzing all over the place, but I had to improvise and I've been persecuted because of it".

He didn't seem to realise that what he'd built was an actual motorcycle. Only in Yorkshire.


Signs of hope for Harley



Anecdotally it seems to be a sellers' market for bikes at the moment. Although there are many people who've had a lean time of it this past year, there are also many others who are sitting on substantial lockdown savings (it builds up when you can't go on holiday or even down the pub). So, after six years of decline, Harley sales in the USA have risen by around a third in the first quarter of this year, sending the share price up by almost 10%.

So far this increase in sales hasn't been repeated in Europe but the signs are hopeful.


